Manuela Perteghella – Climate Change Action Group Proposal.

Ms Perteghella would like to establish a climate change action group to collaborate with the Flood Action Group to find ways to reduce the carbon footprint of the village. Projects might include establishing an orchard, using renewable power sources for the Village Hall, planting trees to alleviate flooding, working with the school or coordinating waste recycling for the summer fete. This group could act as the coordinating body when applying for grants or other relevant funding. The Parish Council were very supportive of the idea and suggested placing an article in Welford Matters to gauge interest.

Tony Brookes – Welford on Avon Sports Club

Mr Brookes attending to give the Parish Council an update on the planned move to Hawkins Field. He reported:

WSC would like to provide both a sporting and community facility. It would allow access to low energy and disability sport as well as traditional activities. Synder Meadow is not an ideal location mainly due to flooding. Mr Brookes would like to see a community organisation set up to manage this development and find funding. The Parish Council were supportive of idea and suggested Mr Brookes sought some expressions of interest in the position of Chair of such a group initially.
