Public Participation:

Residents joined the meeting to present pre-application plans for the renovation of their property (Pool Close House). They have already discussed with neighbours who are supportive and wanted to engage with the Parish Council in advance of submitting their plans to Stratford District Council. The PC thanked the residents for their positive engagement and shared feedback on important considerations relating to the plans such as, landscaping treatments adjacent to public right of way and Conservation Area, Construction Management Plan and external lighting.

	Cllr Brain reported on the following:			
	Cllr Brain confirmed he will not be standing for re-election at the County Council Election to be held on the 6 th May.			
	Further the easing of Government Covid restrictions, schools will be opening again to all pupils from 8 th April.			
	Severn Trent have been attending to some works on High St.			
	Long Marston build-outs (chicanes) are under construction. Welford Parish Council will watch with interest to assess whether these could be a viable option to calm traffic speeds along the High St.			

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WCC Highways should be resurfacing Welford High Street in June. Action - PC to post note in Welford Matters asking all residents to cut back any vegetation adjacent to footpaths to ensure they remain accessible. If any hedges along the High St still require cutting back after this note, then Highways will write to specific residents.

Cllr Brain confirmed he would request funds from his remaining budget to be used for installing kerb sets in Church St to protect the verges from erosion.

Consent given for the Parish Council to install village gateways themselves.

The Parish Council agreed to re-paint the Welford sign at the top of Cress Hill.

District Councillor's Report -

Cllr Perteghella reported the following:

On the 22 Feb the Council debated and voted on the principle of a merger of Stratford and Warwick District Councils. This could be precursor to a South Warwickshire Unitary Council, an alternative to the County Council's proposal for a single county unitary council. There is a lot of work still needed and communication with residents will be vital. Some of the potential issues are Council tax harmonization (WDC has higher CT threshold), the number of Councillors (there must be proper representation) and Planning must remain local.

The Parish Council requested to see results of the cost benefit analysis conducted by Deloitte. Cllr Perteghella to share.

Kehlstein – the developer has cut down trees and hedgerow to the front of the site that should have been retained and protected during construction as part of the approved planning permission. Cllr Perteghella and the PC have reported the issue to SDC. SDC Legal Department have advised Planning Enforcement that the felling of these trees has resulted in a development that can no longer be implemented in full accordance with the approved plans. The developers therefore need to re-apply for permission.

On the 3rd May there will be a Local Government Boundary review. The recommendation is to increase the number of Councillors from 36 to 41. Welford is one of the biggest wards.

Station Works – 2 enforcement issues relating to the felling of Ash trees and dumping of spoil on site remain open. Cllr Perteghella and PC to contact Duchy Homes again to push for resolution.

The Parish Council proposed that if this issue cannot be resolved shortly by the developer and the Enforcement team, an alternative solution could be to ask the developer to donate trees to the village.

Residents have complained that the dog waste bins are often really full. Problem areas - High St, Duck Lane, Pool Close. The PC is in discussion with SDC to resolve the issue. The bins are being emptied regularly. The PC will review the number of bins in light of the increased number of walkers and dogs since lockdown.

The newly dressed footpath from The Bell to Duck Lane is beautiful, thank you!
