6.2 Any Other Finance Matters

It was noted that the phone box would need to be included on the asset register once acquired and that it would also need to be insured. **ACTION: CIIr Lake**

The bank reconciliations for the period April to July 2025 were agreed and signed by Cllr Lake.

The clerk reported on the 2024 Audit findings which had been previously circulated to councillors.

Expenditure of £1645 - £2,760 for Warwickshire Archaeology to have a watching brief on the Synder Meadow development was approved (proposed Cllr Hockaday, seconded Cllr Stanley). Cllr Lake would include this in the cashflow forecast for Synder Meadow.

ACTION: Cllr Lake

Cllr Stanley asked for a separate report on Synder Meadow expenditure each month so that councillors could accurately monitor this. **ACTION:** Cllr Lake

It was reported that Welford Sports Club insurance renewal was imminent and they were enquiring whether they needed Public Liability Insurance for Synder Meadow. Councillors suggested that this be checked against the lease requirements and it was not for the Parish Council to offer advice on this matter. They were however of the view that it was highly probable such insurance would be required.

7. Project Updates from Councillors

Cllr M Stanley

Cllrs Carter and Stanley had met with Graham Stanley, and reviewed the traffic plans for the village, looking at all the options which might be available. There was a plan prepared that was being submitted to WCC Engineering team. This included £7k proposed expenditure for Welford Hill improvements and £18k for crossing points. A meeting would be held in the next month with the engineers. Matched funding of £25k had been secured (WPC would need to match this so £50k in total would be available). Approx 50% of the traffic improvements identified were classed as maintenance so might not require PC expenditure. The first stage was to focus on High St and Long Marston Rd. Some matched funding might be required for the Brockworth Homes footpath along Barton Road. Grahm Stanley had advised that the most appropriate solution for the Welford Bridge was traffic lights however the cost would be c£100k. There was support from the District Councillor for traffic lights.

Once the engineers had reviewed the position the Parish Council would receive costings. The options could then be discussed with the local community.

The Parish Council congratulated Cllr Stanley on the progress he was making and thanked him for his continued efforts.

Cllr J Hockaday

Fundraising meetings were happening regularly. An application had been submitted to NFU and the team should have a response before Christmas. The fundraising team had submitted an applications for National Lottery funds and would also be applying to JLR. There was a proposal to have a series of fundraising events on site in May/June 2026. Present ideas included a Rugby Club dinner, bingo nights. curry & quiz night, golf day, tournaments by football & cricket clubs. Hinton were setting up on site now and would be fully active next week.

Cllr D Jones

Cllr Jones was organizing the Remembrance Day celebrations. There were more restrictions relating to both traffic management and event organization this year as the result of new guidance relating to terrorism. Additional steps would need to be taken to protect traffic marshalls and those attending. Cllr Jones outlined arrangements currently in place and those still outstanding.
